Today is the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
February 5, 2012

**FIRST READING:** Job 7:1-4,6-7

*I shall not see happiness again.*

**SECOND READING:** 1 Corinthians 9:16-19,22-23

*I am ruined if I do not preach the gospel!*

**GOSPEL:** Mark 1:29-39

*He would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.*

Imagine the life of Jesus as Mark sees it, with God for a father and on speaking terms with demons. No wonder he was intensely faithful to prayer. He rises early and goes to a lonely place which rebounds with spirits, both the shrieking and the celestial kind. The uncomprehending friends track him down and tell him everyone is looking for him. Jesus must be thinking: "You mean everyone else." There is no alone for him. There is merely the seen and the unseen.

When he discovered by his friends, he declines he invitation to go back to where he has become, after one day, a celebrity. Let us move on, he says, to do what I have come to do. And he moves on from synagogue to synagogue, preaching and exorcising demons. He is engaged in a twofold battle, to shatter the authority of hell and to open people's eyes to the cosmic dimensions that he sees.

Mark's Gospel aims at revelation, and we hear no details of what Jesus is preaching and teaching in these towns. What is important is who he is, as revealed in his baptism at the start of this chapter. The demons know very well who he is. But do even his closest disciples suspect the power of his name?

### **Questions for Reflection**

- When have you raged against suffering or injustice? What answers were you able to find in prayer?
- Consider Paul's role as "chameleon for Christ." What would Paul have to become to convince you of the urgency of the Gospel?
- If Jesus were to come to your house today, what demon might you be asked to be relieved of?

### **Action Response**

You may not be the type who would stand on a street corner and shout about Jesus. But choose a place, a situation, a relationship in your life where you are willing to explore the passionate side of your call to faith.

- ✓ undergo a background check by law enforcement,
- ✓ read and accept the Diocesan Policy regarding Sexual Misconduct or Abuse of a Minor, and
- ✓ read and accept the Diocesan Code of Conduct.
- ✓ Provide Teaching Touching Safety for children in the Religious Education Program and School
- ✓ Designated a Safe Environment Coordinator
- ✓ Appropriate displays and postings of promotional materials supplied by the Diocese

Another way to ensure that children are protected is that during parish events that parents to escort their children (under the age of 12) to the restrooms.

By law, many who work with children are mandatory reporters of alleged abuse; however, in the interest of a safe environment, all adults should consider themselves mandatory reporters of any alleged abuse. ## FAITH AND FINANCES

### CHILDREN AND MONEY – ALLOWANCES

A woman called the other day wondering what I thought about allowances for younger children. She and her husband had two different perspectives. He felt allowances should be earned. She, on the other hand, remembered her mom being very generous with her and her siblings when they were growing up. Allowances weren't linked to specific tasks and chores, but were in the form of a gift. She had fond memories of her mom's generosity and love, and wanted to pass along those same memories to her children.

Allowances fall into something of a hybrid category, and how we handle them will depend on the goals we are trying to achieve through them. Having a great deal of German in my heritage, it seems natural that allowances be used to help children understand the value of hard work. After all, St. Paul said, "If anyone will not work, let him not eat" (2 Thess 3:10).

With that said, the woman made an important point. Parental love should be a reflection of God's love. And God's love is a free gift. As the Catechism says, "Grace is *favor*, the *free and undeserved help* that God gives us to respond to his call to become children of God, adoptive sons, partakers of the divine nature and of eternal life" (CCC 1996).

When establishing allowances, include reward for work *and* generosity that flows from the unconditional love you have for your children. In that way, your allowance system will reflect a Godly balance. God love you!
