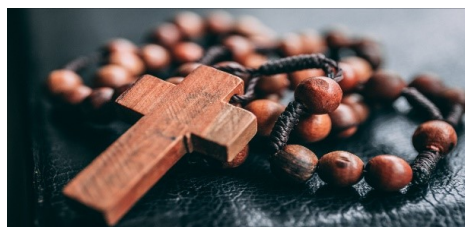

In a parish of over 1100 families, it can be difficult to put faces with names! We hope you are acquainted at least with the other parishioners who attend the Mass you attend, but we want to show you some faces, names and the stories of other people who make up our wonderful Basilica of Saint Peter parish.

Meet Charlotte Blackstone

Enthusiasm, energy, experience and empathy are words friends and former colleagues use to describe this Chicago born parishioner and recently **retired mental health counselor** who moved south in 1997 and soon after joined St. Peter's parish.

With two sons who are US Naval Academy

grads, Charlotte's move south was made to be closer to family and new grandchildren living here then. She quickly found employment and a parish. St. Peter's attracted her with its beautiful stained glass windows, prayerful liturgies and diverse congregation.

Charlotte is the former supervisor of the **SC Dept of Mental Health's Columbia Area Child Welfare Programs**. She has a background in business with a Masters in Counseling. She is also the most recently trained leader of our **Stephen Ministry**. In 2017, after six years as a SM, she received additional training to serve as a Stephen Leader joining *Deacon Ron Anderson* and *Zenovie Gibson* in that role.

Both her sons are currently residents of Virginia, so she frequently travels in the opposite direction now to Chicago and Virginia to see family, including a twin sister. But this has become home and Charlotte can often be seen at the Spanish Mass which she loves because of its music and family atmosphere. Nonetheless, you may also spot her at the Sunday 11am mass or Saturday vigil.

In 1969, Charlotte survived a **near death experience** which deepened her desire to help others. She felt that the Lord had a reason for sparing her and decided she could help those struggling to cope by developing her natural gifts for compassion, listening and love of children. She completed her education and training which exposed her to a wide variety of situations and care for troubled families, children, and adults.

Twelve years of Catholic education grounded her in a belief that she's "never alone and that God is always there to help;" She finds **nourishment** in her daily rosary as well as in nature and animals with her own backyard in Chapin being a certified wildlife sanctuary. This means she promises to give food and water to wildlife passing through or residing there with her beloved dog, Solara.

Being a **Stephen Leader** is now **a top priority**, but Charlotte hasn't abandoned interests in camping, swimming, reading, writing short stories and poetry and "trying new things."

She and other Stephen Ministers provide one-on-one confidential, emotional, and spiritual support to persons going through "a tough time." This may be due to grief, stress, unemployment, debt, separation, divorce, chronic illness - just to name a few of the burdens- that can be shared with Charlotte or another SM to whom one is assigned.

Feel free to **strike up a conversation** on a shared interest or just say "Hi!" to this dynamic and usually broadly smiling parishioner. She's happy to chat and it may just eventually lead to allowing someone who is hurting - whether a fellow parishioner or someone known to a parishioner - to get the support needed when they are struggling to cope.
