As we enter the Advent Season, I reflect on our need to be spiritually prepared for the nativity of our Lord this Christmas. My mind turns to the children of Saint Peter's Catholic School and what we as a parish, through our dedicated administrators, teachers and volunteers do each day to help form these wonderful children in the mind-set of the Gospel.

The value of a Catholic education is priceless. What we give the children of Saint Peter's Catholic School is a safe, challenging, and nurturing environment to learn and grow in. Our young people grow to realize and believe they are children of God. In this day and age, when the world around us swirls with currents of strife and so many reject the faith of Christ, being a student in such a wonderful, faith-filled environment is truly an exceptional gift.

The cost of a Catholic Education goes up each year, but due to your support, we have only increased tuition once in the past decade. Today the per pupil cost to educate just one student exceeds \$8,000. While tuition for our Parishioners is just \$5,250, it remains beyond the means many families can afford and is yet the least costly of ANY private or parochial school in this city. However, **this year, with your support, we were able to give more than 40 families financial assistance making it possible for parents to send their children to our school.**

Every year I am moved by your generosity and support of Saint Peter's Catholic School and once again, I pray the Holy Spirit moves you to give generously to our tuition assistance fund. The future of the Church lies in her children. May many more be blessed because we made a Catholic education possible for them.

Thank you for believing in the value of a Catholic education and helping continue our legacy of service to Catholic and Non-Catholic families alike who similarly place their hope and the formation of their children in our hands!

The Christmas Season

We all know that the secular Christmas season begins earlier and earlier each year and seems to end once the presents are unwrapped. The liturgical season of Christmas, however, begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 13th, this year). During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts, and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him...including the fact that he was born to die for us.



Sunday, January 6th

The Epiphany of the Lord

The Epiphany of Our Lord is the Christian feast observed on January 6th. The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek *epiphainen*, a verb that means "to shine upon," "to manifest," or "to make known." Thus, the feast of the Epiphany celebrates the many ways that Christ has made Himself known to the world, mainly the three events that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11). The visit of the Magi is emphasized on Epiphany Day, and Christ's baptism is celebrated the first Sunday that follows.

Las Posadas

December 23rd-24th

The Posadas re-enact Joseph and Mary's difficult journey to Bethlehem and search for shelter for Christ's birth. There is a procession of adults and children with music that accompanies a couple dressed like Joseph and Mary, traveling to three houses each night asking for shelter. The third house receives them, and there is prayer and reflection. Then the feast continues with foods, music, fireworks, piñata, etc. The "Posadas" allow us a glimpse of Joseph and Mary's feelings at not finding a place for Jesus to be born. But also their joy for the New Born king. Let us in a joy-prayerful spirit, follow the example of the immigrant Holy Family of Nazareth, who trusted amidst their suffering that God would never abandon them.

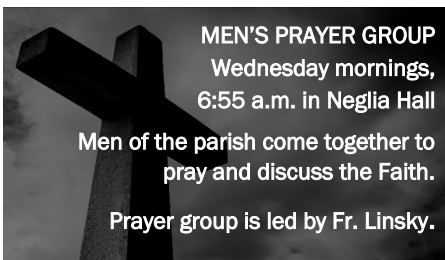

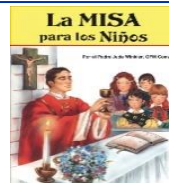
