October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month



1 in 8 women in the U.S. will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime. Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in women. It is the second leading cause of cancer death after lung cancer. Mammograms are the most commonly used diagnostic tool. I urge you to follow your doctor's advice about the frequency of getting a mammogram. Free mammograms are available for women age 40 and older at Palmetto Health, 1801 Sunset Drive, 2nd floor on Tuesdays 5-7 PM. Registration is required: 803-296-2273

Flu Season Vaccination

The annual flu season is upon us again. You may have seen many advertisements from pharmacies, sometimes in grocery stores. Most health plans cover the cost of the vaccine. Everyone 6 months and older should get a flu vaccine every season. Vaccination is particularly important for people who are at high risk of serious complications from influenza (infants and young children, older persons, persons with chronic diseases). Flu vaccine can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations.

As of May 12, 2018, The State Newspaper reported that 271 people had died across the state during the 2017-2018 flu season. Persons 65 and older made up the largest portion of flu fatalities (196).

Different flu vaccines are approved for use in different groups of people. There are many flu vaccine options to choose from. CDC (Centers for Disease Control) does not recommend one vaccine over another. The most important thing is for all people over 6 months to get a flu vaccine every year. If you have questions about which vaccine is best for you, talk to your doctor.

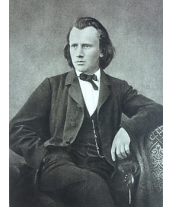
The Basilica of Saint Peter

From the Rector's Desk:



It is with a sense of profound personal sadness I write to inform you that Father Bernard Kyara who has been in-residence at Saint Peter's for the past 12 years, is being transferred by his religious superior who desires that he live, once again, among the priests and brothers of his community. He will be temporarily assigned to the order's regional headquarters near Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, pending the release of a more permanent assignment. Father Bernard has not been based in his home country of Tanzania since his initial entry into the order and longs to return to Africa to be closer to his family. Father Bernard's last day at Providence Hospital will be on November 5th and he will celebrate his last Mass at Saint Peter's at 6:00 p.m. on All Saints' Day, Thursday, November 1st.

I strongly encourage you to join our parish community in praying for Father Bernard as he moves on in his service of the Gospel. Please join us for Mass at 6:00 p.m. on November 1st and for the potluck that will follow. While Father Bernard probably would not ask for gifts given how lightly he travels, I'm sure he will welcome cards bearing your sentiments and enclosures that will help him with personal expenses not reimbursed by his order.

Father Bernard's departure will be deeply felt by the many he has ministered to both at Providence Hospital and here at Saint Peter's. I have been anointed four times – three by him and know personally of the power of his faith and prayer. We will miss him greatly!

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

On Sunday, October 14, at 9:00 Mass, we celebrated The Rite of Acceptance and Welcome into the Order of Catechumens for 11 adults.

The Rite is the first of the “threshold rites” of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), the first public ritual. In the Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens, a change of identity takes place: those previously known as inquirers become catechumens. They are officially welcomed by the Church as disciples, members (albeit not yet full members) of the household of faith. The text calls this rite “the first consecration by the Church of those seeking Christian initiation. For those who are unbaptized, they are literally marked with the cross of Christ as God’s own and for those who have been baptized in another faith tradition, they are signed with the cross of Christ as a reminder of their Baptism into Christ’s saving death and resurrection.

Matthew Morrison, Arturo Paniagua, Elizabeth Martinez and Yeime Santos were accepted into the Order of Catechumens. In the months to come they will prepare for initiation into the Christian faith through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

Brandon Eaves, Allyson Long, Nancy Medlin, Christopher Moellering, Savanna Rivera, Richard Shobe, Blake Stephens who, already one with us by baptism, were welcomed into the Order of Catechumens in preparation to be received into full communion of the Catholic Church and complete their Christian Initiation through Confirmation and Eucharist.

Baptismal Preparation

- **Both parents are asked to be present at the Baptism.** However, if for some valid reason one parent cannot attend the class, the Catholic parent must attend.
- As part of the Baptismal Rite, parents are promising to raise their child in the faith. So that the Church may have an expectation that the child will be raised in the Faith, parents must be registered, **participating members of St. Peter’s for at least 6 months.**
- **You must attend a baptismal preparation class.** At this session we will explore the meaning of the sacrament and familiarize you with how the Baptism is celebrated. Please contact Donna Tomasini at donna@visitstpeters.org or 803-779-0036 to find out when the next class will be offered.

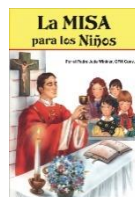
