



EXPAND SAINT PETER'S CAPACITY

FOR MINISTRY, SERVICE AND FELLOWSHIP (\$2,190,000)



Ana Hidalgo worked for more than two years in a cramped closet office at the front of the Cardinal Bernardin Center, insufficient for her work as the Director of Hispanic Ministry. Although she has assumed occupancy of Father Fryml's old office, we continue with make-shift office space for part-time employees and critical volunteers; should we be blessed with an additional priest in the future, we would have no place for him to work.

hen the Cardinal Bernardin Center was completed in 2005, parish leaders knew it would soon be outgrown:

- Our beautiful Neglia Hall is no longer large enough for major gatherings, but still too large for small group meetings and classes.
- As Saint Peter's ministries expand, and the number of registered families continues to increase, our parish staff has grown to meet the greater demand - but office space has remained the same and become crowded.




TO MEET THE **GROWING NEEDS OF THE PARISH**—and then be prepared for the next century of ministry, we will:

- **Expand the square** footage of Neglia Hall by 33%, while remaining within the current footprint of the Cardinal Bernardin Center. This expansion will improve the overall useability of the space for larger gatherings, allowing us to welcome more parishioners, families, and guests into the life of Saint Peter's.
- Renovate, re-organize, and add administrative and professional office spaces to the west end of the Cardinal Bernardin Center.
- **Increase and improve** available parking by clearing, paving, and lining the former Key Shop property.



LAY THE CORNERSTONE FOR A NEW CENTURY

OF CATHOLIC FORMATION (\$3,650,000)









urrent meeting space is limited to our Conference Room, Youth Room, or Gibson and Neglia Halls, each either too small or too large for many of our adult formation classes and small groups, competing for use among our many parish and school programs, or simply not suitable for activities for youth and children.

- Our adult and young adult faith formation programs have grown tremendously. This critical aspect of our ministry enriches the spiritual lives of parish family members and introduces non-Catholics to the truth and beauty of our faith. These activities need and deserve dedicated and consistently available meeting space.
- Before COVID-19, and even before our designation as a basilica, we regularly faced standing-room-only crowds on Christmas, Easter, and popular feasts such as Our Lady of Guadalupe. Our need for Mass overflow capacity has been growing; but relying on Neglia Hall to meet that need prohibits its use for anything else on the weekends.
- Enrollment at our parish school is the highest it's been in years, due in part to the successful implementation of a 3-year-old kindergarten program—a beautiful and practical way to ensure the future vitality of Saint Peter's Catholic School by providing a feeder program for later grades. However, the addition of the new grade level has reduced the amount of flexible space available to the school, causing yet more competition for meeting and activity space on campus.

A New HALL

A new hall, located on Assembly Street between our school and the basilica, will provide class- and meeting rooms for adult formation and fellowship. Its large multipurpose space will accommodate a variety of parish and school events, as well as capacity for Mass overflow.

ESTABLISH THIRD CENTURY FUND (\$450,000)

- Using parish savings in the summer of 2019, we completed the purchase of the Key Shop property. More recently, we replaced our pews and kneelers, refinished the floors of the basilica, made final plaster repairs, and enhanced our Peragallo pipe organ. We moved forward with these latest investments just as we began to emerge from the COVID-19 shutdown. Our Third Century Fund will replenish our savings via a special fund primarily held in reserve for times of crisis, ensuring Saint Peter's will always be prepared to respond to emergencies without risking interruption to core ministries and programs.
- A silver lining to the COVID-19 crisis was our discovery that by live-streaming Masses online, we were able to reach thousands of **people**—parishioners and non-parishioners alike—with the beauty of the Mass, using little more than an iPhone and an internet connection. We also learned how essential it is to be able to communicate with parishioners in a variety of ways to keep them informed about what is happening at their parish, and to continue to provide opportunities to deepen their faith. A portion of the Third Century Fund will be devoted to continuing to enhance the live-streaming of Masses, improving our data systems, and strengthening our ability to communicate with parishioners not just in times of crisis, but throughout the year.


Lord, you are the glory of the saints, the balm of the sick, the love of the devout, the consolation of the suffering, and the hope of all who aspire to follow you.

Through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Patron Saint Peter, and his successor Pope Saint John Paul the Second, we pray:


