Romans 5:5-11

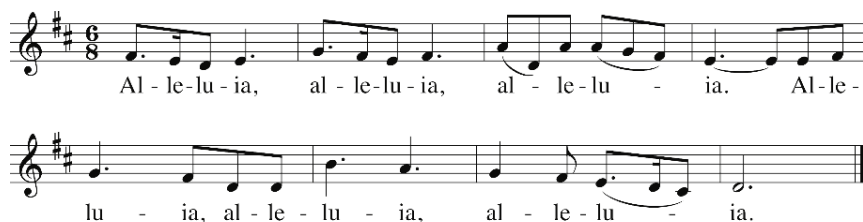

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Nicene Creed

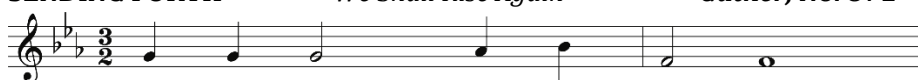
PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL

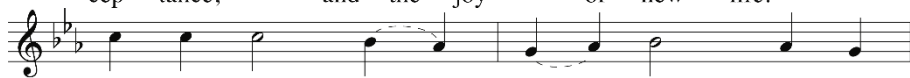
